4. Participant behavior

Participants are required to respect the directives of the officials in charge of the competition.

Any competitor who, directly or indirectly, expresses inappropriately to the officials or their decisions or as to the officials' notes, may be suspended and excluded from any subsequent competition.

5. Restrictions

The committee reserves the right to limit the number of participants in each category. Its decision is final. Number limit:

9. Test deadline

The test deadline is the same as the registration deadline.

10. Scoring system

- a) The **"CPC"** cumulative points calculation system is used for events judged in CPC. (see appendices)
- b) The **"Performance standard with classification" system**. (See appendices)
- c) The system of **"Performance Standard"**.(See appendices)

11. Music

The skater's music (STAR2 and +) must be uploaded to SPLEX when registering for the competition. The music must be saved as an MP3 file for downloading.

In the event of a technical problem with the athlete's music during the competition, the coach must provide A USB key of the music in MP3 format.

12. Participant accreditation

All skaters must register as soon as they arrive at the arena where they will be competing, at least one hour before the start of the event. For categories requiring a program content sheet, this must be handed in when the skaters are accredited.

13. Coach Certification

Coaches must have the minimum NCCP certification for the various competitions.

Scenario 1: Please note that in order to receive free accreditation at various competitions, you must:

- Present the **valid Patinage Québec card**
 - And all additional dates on the card must also be valid (ex: first aid, criminal check, etc.).

Scenario 2: You do not meet the conditions of scenario 1, you must then pay \$15 to receive an accreditation (for the duration of the competition) in the following cases:

- You have a valid Patinage Québec card, but one or more complementary dates are no longer valid:
 - You must have proof of updates.
- You have an invalid Skate Québec card:
 - You have proof of membership with Skate Canada for the current year (the complementary dates must be valid).
 - In the event that the complementary dates are not valid, you must have proof of updating.
- You do not have a Skate Québec card, but your name is on the list of coaches in good standing
- You do not have a Skate Québec card, your name is not on the list of coaches en règle, but you have on hand:
 - Proof of membership in Skate Canada for the current season
 - Valid first aid certificate
 - Criminal record check certificate
 - Certificate of completion of the "Respect and Sport" course
 - Certificate "Code of Ethics"
 - OR a screen printout from the Skate Canada website displaying the dates of the tests and certificates mentioned above.

Scenario 3: You do not meet the conditions of scenarios 1 or 2, you will not be accredited and must then be replaced with your athlete by a coach in good standing.

- If entry is refused to the coach (not in good standing), the person responsible for accreditation will notify the technical representative so that this coach does not appear in the rooms or on the edge of the band.

During accreditation

Coaches must register in person and present their coaches' card. They must wear it around their neck at all times.

ELIGIBILITY

For all categories, skaters must be eligible individuals according to Skate Canada's [rules](#).

Special Olympics Canada (SOC) figure skating rules are based on Skate Canada's CanSkate and STAR Skate programs. International Skating Union (ISU) or Skate Canada rules apply, except in the case of conflict with SOC's official figure skating sport rules, in which case the latter shall prevail. Note: Any reference to permitted vocal music is for Skate Canada national events only.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

The Special Olympics Canada-Sport d'hiver figure skating regulations must be consulted before each competition. This documentation is available on the Special Olympics Canada website. In these documents, you will find the program content for each category.

Division

No more than 8 skaters per group. When there are more than 8 skaters registered for the same level, a division round is required. In the event of an odd number of skaters, the largest group would form the group "A" (highest level group) for the divisional round.

Divisional round for finals

If a divisional round is required, skaters will be assigned to a warm-up group. As soon as a group finishes its warm-up, its competition begins (Warm-up group 1 - competition group 1). Division round results are not displayed, only the groups in which skaters will compete. If the number of skaters is odd, the skaters in the highest level group will be odd-numbered.

In the event of a tie, program component scores will be used to break the tie. If there is still a tie, the skater with the least merit evaluations will break the tie, followed by the number of bronze evaluations, etc. For dance events - only 1 dance will be used for a divisional round (drawn at random on the day of competition).

Planned program sheets

Mandatory for all free skating and pair events.

****Coaches and skaters** are required to submit the program sheets provided at the time of registration
At all singles and pairs events (please use the form provided)

Grading

All events are graded. The final ranking will be displayed, but not the total scores.

For more information, please consult the appendix on rating.

Report cards

After the event, all skaters will receive a report card specifying the evaluation of each prescribed element and each program component or CPC score depending on the event and level.

Medals

All skaters who place in the top three receive a medal. No medals will be awarded for the introductory level dance **Performance Standard**.

Vocal music is permitted for singles and pairs events.

- Each element may only be attempted **once**.
